11	An Act relating to long-term care; amending 63 O.S. 2021, Section 1-890.3, which relates to rules
12	promulgated under the Continuum of Care and Assisted Living Act; directing promulgation of specified
13	rules; updating statutory language; requiring assisted living centers to establish internal quality
14	assurance committee; specifying committee duties and membership composition; providing for codification;
15	and providing an effective date.
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18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
19	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2021, Section 1-890.3, is
20	amended to read as follows:
21	Section 1-890.3. A. The State Board Commissioner of Health
22	shall promulgate rules necessary to implement the provisions of the
23	Continuum of Care and Assisted Living Act. Such rules shall
24	include, but shall not be limited to:

A uniform comprehensive resident screening instrument to
 measure the needs and capabilities of residents in all settings and
 to determine appropriate placements of residents;

Physical plant requirements meeting construction and life
 safety codes, with provisions accommodating resident privacy and
 independence in assisted living centers and in assisted living
 components of continuum of care facilities based on the variable
 capabilities of residents;

9 3. Staffing levels responsive to the variable needs of
10 residents, with provisions for sharing of staff between components
11 in a continuum of care facility;

Minimum standards for resident care including, but not
 limited to, standards pertaining to medical care and administration
 of medications. Standards pertaining to medication administration
 shall, at a minimum, require the assisted living center or continuum
 of care facility to:

- a. provide or arrange qualified staff to administer
 medications based on the needs of residents,
- 19 <u>b.</u> follow medication administration orders from a
 20 qualified health care provider,
- 21c.ensure that medications are reviewed monthly by a22Registered Nurse or pharmacist and quarterly by a23consultant pharmacist,
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 <u>d.</u> maintain medication administration records and

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 <u>document all medication administration in such</u>

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 records, and
- 5 <u>5.</u> Standards for measuring quality outcomes for residents;
 6 <u>5.</u> <u>6.</u> Provisions for individualized services chosen by and
 7 designed for each resident;

have medication storage and disposal policies;

- 8 6. 7. Provisions to prohibit facility staff from disclosing a 9 resident's financial information to third parties without written 10 consent of the resident or the designated representative of the 11 resident;
- 12 7. 8. Procedures for inspections and investigations of licensed
 13 entities to ensure compliance with the Continuum of Care and
 14 Assisted Living Act and rules promulgated by the Board Commissioner;

8. 9. Enumeration of resident rights and responsibilities to be 15 observed by each facility and its staff. Such resident rights shall 16 include the freedom of choice regarding any personal attending 17 physicians and all other providers of medical services and supplies, 18 providing that the minimum standards are met by the provider 19 pursuant to the Continuum of Care and Assisted Living Act, without a 20 financial penalty or fee charged by the assisted living center; 21 9. 10. Provisions for a surety bond or deposit from each 22 applicant in an amount sufficient to guarantee that obligations to 23 residents will be performed, with provisions for reduction or waiver 24

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1 of the surety bond or deposit when the assets of the applicant or 2 its contracts with other persons are sufficient to reasonably ensure 3 the performance of its obligations;

4 10. <u>11.</u> Provisions for the development of a consumer guide or 5 similar resource to be posted on the Internet website of the State 6 Department of Health to assist individuals and families in 7 understanding the services provided by assisted living centers and 8 to compare and select a facility; and

9 <u>11. 12.</u> Provisions for posting results of routine inspections 10 and any complaint investigations of each assisted living center on 11 the Internet website of the Department. Such information shall be 12 regularly updated to include the facility's plan of correction and 13 to indicate when a violation of a licensing regulation was corrected 14 by the facility; and

15 <u>13. Provisions requiring execution of a plan of care and a</u> 16 <u>resident service contract with the resident or resident's</u> 17 representative.

B. The nursing care service of a continuum of care facility shall be subject to the requirements, procedures and remedies set out in the Nursing Home Care Act, including provisions relating to resident rights.

C. The adult day care component of a continuum of care facility shall be subject to requirements and procedures specified under the Adult Day Care Act.

NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 1 SECTION 2. in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-890.9 of Title 63, unless 2 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 3 A. Each assisted living center shall establish and maintain an 4 5 internal quality assurance committee that meets at least quarterly. The committee shall: 6 Monitor trends and incidents; 7 1. 2. Monitor customer satisfaction measures; 8 9 3. Document quality assurance efforts and outcomes; 10 4. Recommend internal policies on resident care including, but not limited to, policies on administration of medications; and 11 12 5. Perform such other duties or functions as directed by the 13 State Commissioner of Health through rule. The quality assurance committee shall include at least the Β. 14 15 following: 1. A Registered Nurse or physician if a medical problem is to 16 be monitored or investigated; 17 2. The assisted living center administrator; 18 A direct care staff person or a staff person who has 19 3. responsibility for administration of medications; 20 4. A pharmacist consultant if a medication problem is to be 21 monitored or investigated; and 22 5. A person who has an ownership stake in the assisted living 23 center, or his or her designee. 24
