An Act relating to education; defining terms; prohibiting discrimination on certain basis against students or employees in an institution of higher education or public school; prohibiting persons from being excluded, denied benefits, or discriminated against on certain basis; prohibiting criteria for admission to an institution of higher education course or program from restricting access to certain persons; providing certain exceptions; directing certain services to be available to all students; directing all education programs, activities, and opportunities offered by institutions of higher education and public schools to be made available without certain discrimination; providing certain construction; directing institutions of higher education and public schools to integrate certain definition into certain codes of conduct; prohibiting certain conduct; directing institutions of higher education and public schools to treat certain harassment and discrimination in certain manner; encouraging institutions of higher education and public schools to incorporate certain training and integrate certain curriculum; directing the State Department of Education and the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education to designate certain coordinator; prescribing duties of coordinator; providing for written notice to address certain complaint within certain time period; providing for certain findings to be reported to certain

1 departments; directing submission of annual report;
2 providing for contents of report; providing certain
3 construction; providing for codification; providing
4 an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

6 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
7 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 24-162 of Title 70, unless there
8 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

9 A. As used in this section:

10 1. "Antisemitism" has the same meaning as provided for by the
11 International Holocaust Remembrance Alliance Working Definition of
12 Antisemitism, including its contemporary examples, as it was adopted
13 on May 26, 2016;

14 2. "Institution of higher education" means an institution of
15 higher education within The Oklahoma State System of Higher
16 Education; and

17 3. "Public school" shall have the same meaning as provided for
18 in Section 1-106 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

19 B. Discrimination on the basis of race, ethnicity, national
20 origin, sex, disability, religion, or marital status against a
21 student or an employee in an institution of higher education or a
22 public school in this state shall be prohibited. No person in this
23 state shall, on the basis of race, ethnicity, national origin, sex,
24 disability, religion, or marital status, be excluded from

1 participating in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to
2 discrimination under any institution of higher education or public
3 school program or activity or in any employment conditions or
4 practices conducted by an institution of higher education or a
5 public school that receives or benefits from federal or state
6 financial assistance.

7 C. The criteria for admission to a program or course at an
8 institution of higher education shall not have the effect of
9 restricting access by persons of a particular race, ethnicity,
10 national origin, sex, disability, religion, or marital status;
11 provided, this shall not infringe upon the rights of student faith-
12 based organizations and ethnic solidarity organizations to select
13 leadership committed to their group's mission and principles.

14 D. All institution of higher education and public school
15 classes shall be available to all students without regard to race,
16 ethnicity, national origin, sex, disability, religion, or marital
17 status. Provided, however, the provisions of this subsection shall
18 not prohibit the provision of programs designed to meet the needs of
19 students with limited proficiency in English, gifted students, or
20 students with disabilities or programs tailored to students with
21 specialized talents or skills.

22 E. Guidance, counseling, and financial assistance services in
23 institutions of higher education and public schools shall be
24 available to all students equally and provided in the same manner

1 regardless of race, ethnicity, national origin, sex, disability,
2 religion, or marital status.

3 F. All education programs, activities, and opportunities
4 offered by institutions of higher education and public schools shall
5 be made available without discrimination on the basis of race,
6 ethnicity, national origin, sex, disability, religion, or marital
7 status.

8 G. Nothing in this act shall be construed to limit or restrict
9 the implementation, funding, or administration of any Indian
10 education programs or services established under federal or state
11 law.

12 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
13 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 24-163 of Title 70, unless there
14 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

15 A. Institutions of higher education and public schools shall
16 integrate the definition of antisemitism provided for in Section 1
17 of this act into their student, faculty, and employee codes of
18 conduct. Prohibited conduct as it specifically relates to
19 antisemitism shall include harassment and discrimination against
20 Jews in compliance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and
21 antidiscrimination regulations provided by the United States
22 Department of Education and the United States Department of Justice.

23 B. Institutions of higher education and public schools shall
24 treat harassment of or discrimination against students or employees

1 or resulting from institutional policies or programs on their
2 campuses motivated by or including antisemitic intent in an
3 identical manner to discrimination motivated by race.

4 C. All institutions of higher education and public schools are
5 encouraged to:

6 1. Incorporate antisemitism awareness training for all
7 students, faculty, administrators, and campus police;

8 2. Integrate Jewish American heritage curriculum for students
9 that incorporates Jewish experiences in the United States of America
10 pre- and post-revolution, pre- and post-World War II and the
11 Holocaust, and in modern times; and

12 3. Place reasonable time, place, and manner restrictions on
13 speech to ensure order and protect the rights of all students.

14 D. 1. The State Department of Education shall designate a
15 Title VI coordinator dedicated to monitoring antisemitic
16 discrimination and harassment in public schools in this state. All
17 public schools shall electronically report incidents and complaints
18 of antisemitic discrimination and harassment to the Title VI
19 coordinator. The Title VI Coordinator shall establish, maintain,
20 and publicize a formal reporting process whereby students, parents,
21 staff, and faculty can submit complaints of antisemitic
22 discrimination and harassment.

23 2. The Title VI coordinator designated pursuant to paragraph 1
24 of this subsection shall thoroughly investigate all submitted

1 complaints. If after a reasonable investigation a Title VI
2 coordinator determines that a public school has engaged in, allowed,
3 or not sufficiently prohibited antisemitic discrimination, the State
4 Department of Education shall provide written notice to the public
5 school to address the complaint within thirty (30) days of receiving
6 the notice.

7 3. If the Title VI coordinator determines that the public
8 school has not taken the necessary actions to address the complaint
9 within thirty (30) days of receiving the notice, the Department
10 shall report its findings to the United States Department of
11 Education and the United States Department of Justice by making a
12 complaint under Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964.

13 E. 1. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall
14 designate a Title VI coordinator dedicated to monitoring antisemitic
15 discrimination and harassment in institutions of higher education in
16 this state. All institutions of higher education shall
17 electronically report incidents and complaints of antisemitic
18 discrimination and harassment to the Title VI coordinator.

19 2. The Title VI coordinator designated pursuant to paragraph 1
20 of this subsection shall thoroughly investigate all submitted
21 complaints. If after a reasonable investigation a Title VI
22 coordinator determines that an institution of higher education has
23 engaged in, allowed, or not sufficiently prohibited antisemitic
24 discrimination, the State Regents shall provide written notice to

1 the institution of higher education to address the complaint within
2 thirty (30) days of receiving the notice.

3 3. If the Title VI coordinator determines that the institution
4 of higher education has not taken the necessary actions to address
5 the complaint within thirty (30) days of receiving the notice, the
6 State Regents shall report their findings to the United States
7 Department of Education and the United States Department of Justice
8 by making a complaint under Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of
9 1964.

10 F. No later than June 30, 2026, and June 30 each subsequent
11 year, the Title VI coordinators designated pursuant to paragraph 1
12 of subsections D and E of this section shall electronically submit
13 to the Legislature a report on antisemitism in institutions of
14 higher education and public schools.

15 G. The Legislature is encouraged to conduct hearings and/or
16 investigations to assess if institutions are adequately addressing
17 antisemitic harassment and discrimination; if not, the Legislature
18 should consider reducing or eliminating state funding to such
19 institutions.

20 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
21 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 24-164 of Title 70, unless there
22 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

23 A. Nothing in this act shall be construed to diminish or
24 infringe upon any right protected under the First Amendment to the

1 United States Constitution or Section 22 of Article II of the
2 Oklahoma Constitution.

3 B. Nothing in this act shall be construed to conflict with
4 federal or state discrimination laws.

5 SECTION 4. This act shall become effective July 1, 2025.

6 SECTION 5. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
7 of the public peace, health, or safety, an emergency is hereby
8 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
9 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
