8	An Act relating to state government; amending 74 O.S. 2021, Section 150.12A-1, which relates to the Office
9	of Missing and Murdered Indigenous Persons; deleting federal funding and grant requirements; and providing
10	an effective date.
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13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
14	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2021, Section 150.12A-1,
15	is amended to read as follows:
16	Section 150.12A-1. A. The Oklahoma State Bureau of
17	Investigation shall coordinate with the United States Attorney's
18	Office and the United States Department of Justice to obtain federal
19	funding by January 1, 2022, to coordinate efforts and gather data to
20	address the issue of missing and murdered indigenous persons in the
21	State of Oklahoma. The Bureau shall seek and apply for any
22	applicable federal grants and may coordinate with private entities
23	to obtain funding or fulfill grant requirements.
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B. Upon securing federal funding, the <u>The</u> Bureau shall create
 an Office of Liaison for Missing and Murdered Indigenous Persons.
 Any individual hired within the Office shall have significant
 experience working with tribal communities. Subject to available
 funding, the Office shall include a missing persons specialist.

6 C. The Office of Liaison for Missing and Murdered Indigenous7 Persons shall:

8 1. Work with state, tribal and federal law enforcement agencies
9 on missing persons and homicide cases involving American Indian
10 individuals;

11 2. Develop a best practices protocol for law enforcement 12 response to missing persons reports involving American Indian 13 individuals;

Assist families, tribal agencies and nongovernmental
entities in using the National Missing and Unidentified Persons
System (NamUs) and other resources;

Provide guidance to victims' families with navigating state
 and federal district court cases;

S. Coordinate with other state offices including, but not
 limited to, the Office of the Chief Medical Examiner, agency tribal
 liaisons and the Secretary of Native American Affairs to develop
 training and education on missing and murdered indigenous persons
 issues and the state-tribal government-to-government relationship;

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1	6. Facilitate trainings for law enforcement and members of the
2	public on issues relating to missing and murdered indigenous
3	persons; and
4	7. Consult with community organizations that serve indigenous
5	populations to promote community relations and develop best
6	practices.
7	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2025.
