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11	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
12	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2021, Section 5060.26, is
13	amended to read as follows:
14	Section 5060.26. A. A private, not-for-profit corporation may
15	be organized pursuant to the provisions of Title 18 of the Oklahoma
16	Statutes and the provisions of this act to develop the Industrial
17	Extension System in Oklahoma, with a special emphasis on minority
18	business enterprises. Such corporation, upon certification by
19	Oklahoma Futures, shall be known as and may exercise all of the
20	powers of OAME.
21	B. In addition to the provisions and requirements of Title 18
22	of the Oklahoma Statutes, the certificate of incorporation and the
23	bylaws of OAME must be certified by Oklahoma Futures and the
24	certificate of incorporation shall:

1. Designate the name of the corporation as the Oklahoma Alliance for Manufacturing Excellence, Inc.;

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- 2. Provide that the exclusive purposes of OAME are public purposes to assist small and medium-sized manufacturing firms, with a special emphasis on minority business enterprises, to gain the ability, through education, technology transfer, and otherwise, to compete successfully at progressively higher levels of value-added in the national and international economy;
- 3. Provide for the following three classes of membership in OAME which shall have representation on the Board of Directors of OAME:
 - a. one class composed of small and medium-sized

 manufacturing firms located in Oklahoma, and the

 certificate of incorporation shall provide for the

 qualifications for membership in such class,
 - b. one class composed of large corporations, and the certificate of incorporation shall provide for the qualifications for membership in such class, and
 - c. one class composed of state entities, including, but not limited to, the Oklahoma Center for the Advancement of Science and Technology, the Oklahoma Department of Commerce, the Oklahoma Department of Career and Technology Education, and the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education;

4. Provide for classes of associate membership which shall not have representation on the Board of Directors of OAME, except as provided in paragraph 5 of this subsection;

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5. Provide that the Board of Directors of OAME shall consist of 4 5 five nine representatives of members who shall be individuals elected at the first annual meeting of OAME by members of the class 6 composed of small and medium-sized manufacturing firms, and four 7 representatives of members who shall be individuals elected at the 9 first annual meeting of OAME by members of the class composed of large corporations. The Board of Directors also shall include the 10 11 President following state governmental representatives as ex officio 12 members: the Executive Director of the Oklahoma Center for the Advancement of Science and Technology, the Executive Director of a 13 designee from the Oklahoma Department of Commerce, the Director of 14 and a designee from the Oklahoma Department of Career and Technology 15 Education and the Chancellor of Higher Education as ex officio 16 members (CareerTech). The bylaws of OAME may provide for designees 17 who may serve in the place of any of the directors and the terms 18 under which any such designation will be made. The Board of 19 Directors shall have the power to elect, from time to time, persons 20 to serve as directors who are associate members or are not 21 affiliated with any entity or firm which qualifies for membership in 22 OAME, provided that no more than three (3) of one such persons 23 person shall serve on the Board of Directors at any time; 24

6. Have the authority to set membership dues in an amount to be determined by the Board of Directors. No participating state entity shall pay membership dues;

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- 7. Provide for all powers necessary or appropriate to carry out and effectuate its corporate purposes, including, but not limited to, the following:
 - a. to maintain an office at such place or places as it may designate,
 - b. to make and execute contracts with any individual, corporation, association or any other entity and all other instruments necessary or convenient for the performance of its duties and the exercise of its powers and functions under this act,
 - c. to receive funds from any source to carry out the purposes of this act, including, but not limited to, gifts or grants from any department, agency or instrumentality of the United States or of the state for any purpose consistent with the provisions of this act,
 - d. to acquire or sell, convey, lease, exchange, transfer or otherwise dispose of its property or any interest therein,
 - e. to develop plans and policies to assist small and medium-sized manufacturing companies in Oklahoma,

1	f.	to enter into contracts to provide assistance to small
2		and medium-sized manufacturing companies, including,
3		but not limited to, the following categories:
4		(1) technology,
5		(2) human resources development,
6		(3) market planning,
7		(4) finance, and
8		(5) inter-firm collaboration,
9	g.	to assist other organizations providing general
10		business assistance to small and medium-sized
11		manufacturing enterprises,
12	h.	to establish manufacturing quality and standards
13		certification programs, setting minimum standards and
14		issuing certification to companies meeting such
15		standards,
16	i.	to develop and distribute information about
17		manufacturing modernization and assistance that is
18		available to support efforts to improve the abilities
19		of small and medium-sized firms to produce and market
20		higher value-added products,
21	j.	to establish a system to evaluate the effectiveness
22		and efficiency of services provided to small and
23		medium-sized manufacturing firms,

1	k. to establish and operate, directly or under contract,
2	an information system designed to access resources
3	that will assist the firms to become more productive,
4	l. establish a training program for individuals working
5	on behalf of small and medium-sized manufacturing
6	firms, and
7	m. to establish special educational and informational
8	programs for its members.
9	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2025.
10	SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
11	of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
12	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
13	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
