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9	An Act relating to public health and safety; amending
10	63 O.S. 2021, Section 2-1101, which relates to harm-reduction services; deleting sunset date; and
11	providing an effective date.
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13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
14	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2021, Section 2-1101, is
15	amended to read as follows:
16	Section 2-1101. A. Until July 1, <del>2026</del> <u>2027</u> , the following are
17	hereby authorized to engage in harm-reduction services:
18	1. Government entities including, but not limited to, the State
19	Department of Health and the Department of Mental Health and
20	Substance Abuse Services; provided, no state dollars shall be used
21	to purchase hypodermic needles;
22	2. Religious institutions or churches;
23	3. Nonprofit organizations;
24	4. For-profit companies;

- 5. Nongovernment entities partnering with a governmental agency; and
  - 6. Tribal governments.

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- B. Those offering harm-reduction services shall register with the State Department of Health and may engage in the following activities in order to reduce the use of drugs, prevent outbreaks of infectious diseases and reduce morbidity among people who use injection drugs:
- 9 1. Offer referrals and resources to treat substance use 10 disorders;
- 2. Provide education on the risk of transmission of infectious diseases, including human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) and viral hepatitis;
- 3. Rapid testing for HIV, hepatitis C and sexually transmitted infections (STIs);
  - 4. Referrals for medical and mental health services;
  - 5. Collect used hypodermic needles for safe disposal;
  - 6. Possess and distribute hypodermic needles, cleaning kits, test kits and opioid antagonists; and
  - 7. Rapid substance testing products used, intended for use, or fashioned specifically for the use in identifying or analyzing the potency or toxicity of unknown substances.
- C. Registered providers of harm-reduction services shall report at least quarterly to the State Department of Health and annually to

1	the Governor, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the
2	President Pro Tempore of the Senate:
3	1. The number of clients served including basic demographic
4	information;
5	2. Number and type of referrals provided;
6	3. Number of syringes, test kits and antagonists distributed;
7	4. Number of used syringes collected; and
8	5. Number of rapid HIV and viral hepatitis tests performed
9	including the number of reactive test results.
10	D. The State Commissioner of Health shall promulgate rules for
11	the implementation of this section.
12	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2025.
