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13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
14	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY Section 1, Chapter 106, O.S.L.
15	2024 (74 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 325.20), is amended to read as
16	follows:
17	Section 325.20. A. <del>In lieu of an automatic fire extinguishing</del>
18	system, portable fire extinguishers shall be installed in mobile
19	food establishments that produce All mobile food preparation
20	vehicles operating within this state prior to July 1, 2024, that are
21	capable of producing smoke or grease-laden vapors shall be in
22	compliance with the most current adopted fire code. With the
23	exception of an automatic fire extinguishing system, such
24	requirement shall apply to vehicles including, but not limited to,

- 1 vehicles utilizing electric energy, liquefied petroleum gas,
- 2 compressed natural gas, or a combination thereof for cooking,
- 3 provided that portable fire extinguishers are installed and
- 4 | maintained in accordance with the most current version of NFPA 10:
- 5 | Standard for Portable Fire Extinguishers. All fire extinguishers
- 6 | shall be inspected annually by a licensed contractor. A six-liter
- 7 | Class K-rated, portable fire extinguisher is required for all
- 8 | cooking equipment involving solid fuels or vegetable or animal oils
- 9 and fats or a combination thereof. All portable fire extinguishers
- 10 | shall be in clear view and immediately available for use.
- B. The provisions of this section shall cease to have the force
- 12 and effect of law on November 1, 2025 All liquefied petroleum gas
- 13 | shall be inspected by the Oklahoma Liquefied Petroleum Gas
- 14 | Administration or employees.
- 15 C. The provisions in subsection A of this section shall expire
- 16 on January 1, 2026, and all mobile food preparation vehicles shall
- 17 | comply with the most current adopted fire codes set forth by this
- 18 state.
- D. Mobile food preparation vehicles shall be under the sole
- 20 jurisdiction of the State Fire Marshal and shall be inspected
- 21 | annually by the State Fire Marshal to ensure compliance with the
- 22 | latest version of the state-adopted minimum codes for fire and life
- 23 | safety as adopted by the Oklahoma Uniform Building Code Commission.

1 The State Fire Marshall shall coordinate, at minimum, annual
2 inspections conducted:

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- 1. Within each of the four quadrants of this state; and
- 2. Twice within each county with a population exceeding four

  hundred thousand (400,000) according to the latest Federal Decennial

  Census.
- E. Upon approval, the State Fire Marshal shall issue an operational permit decal indicating that the vehicle meets the minimum fire code requirements as currently adopted at the time of inspection.
  - F. Nothing in this act shall prevent the State Fire Marshal

    from enforcing the minimum fire code requirements as allowed by law

    and revoking the operations of a mobile food preparation vehicle for

    cause when it is determined to be inherently dangerous to the

    health, safety, or welfare of persons within this state.
    - G. Nothing in this act shall prevent a political subdivision from enforcing the event permits, operational fees, land use regulations, zoning, and other ordinances in relation to the operation of a mobile food preparation vehicle within the boundaries of the political subdivision.
  - H. The State Fire Marshal may promulgate rules necessary to implement the provisions of this section. Such rules shall have uniform force and effect throughout this state and no political subdivision or other agency shall enact or enforce any fire or life

1	safety code-related ordinances, rules, or other requirements for
2	mobile food preparation vehicles, except in a county with a
3	population exceeding four hundred thousand (400,000) according to
4	the latest Federal Decennial Census.
5	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2025.
