11	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
12	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
13	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 93 of Title 73, unless there is
14	created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
15	The Department of Public Safety shall create a security plan for
16	the State Capitol Building and grounds. The plan shall be submitted
17	to the State Capitol Preservation Commission. An updated plan shall
18	be submitted every three (3) years.
19	The Department shall coordinate with the Office of Management
20	and Enterprise Services to implement and staff the approved security
21	plan.
22	SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 73 O.S. 2021, Section 176, is
23	amended to read as follows:
24	

1	Section 176. A. There shall be established <u>created within the</u>
2	Legislative Service Bureau the position of a permanent legislative
3	liaison committee, composed of three (3) members from each house,
4	appointed by the President Pro Tempore and Speaker, respectively
5	Capitol Liaison to the State Capitol Preservation Commission. The
6	legislative liaison committee will <u>Capitol Liaison shall</u> keep the
7	Legislature properly advised as to the activities of the Oklahoma
8	Capitol Improvement Authority and the Office of Management and
9	Enterprise Services by making such reports as they deem the Capitol
10	Liaison deems necessary to the appropriate committees and leadership
11	of both houses. All legislative studies concerning the
12	responsibilities or activities of the Oklahoma Capitol Improvement
13	Authority or the Office of Management and Enterprise Services and
14	all studies of activities or projects relating to the Oklahoma State
15	Capitol Complex shall be considered by <u>presented to</u> the liaison
16	committee created by this section Capitol Liaison. The Oklahoma
17	Capitol Improvement Authority and the Office of Management and
18	Enterprise Services shall notify the membership of the legislative
19	liaison committee <u>Capitol Liaison</u> in advance of any meeting in which
20	official or formal action is to be taken by furnishing the proposed
21	agenda in writing at least twenty-four (24) hours in advance of such
22	meeting.

- 1 records, testimony, or recommendations as the committee <u>Capitol</u>
 2 Liaison may require.
- C. All proposals for enhancement, modification, preservation,

 or restoration of the State Capitol Building and grounds shall be

 submitted to the Capitol Liaison. The Capitol Liaison shall submit

 all proposals to the State Capitol Preservation Commission for

 approval.
- D. All proposals for changes in overall allocation in the State

 Capitol Building or parking shall be submitted to the Capitol

 Liaison. The Capitol Liaison shall submit all proposals to the

 State Capitol Preservation Commission for approval, as defined by

 Sections 15.1 and 15.3 of this title.
- E. The Capitol Liaison shall be the primary liaison for all tenants that occupy space in the State Capitol Building.
- SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 73 O.S. 2021, Section 345, is amended to read as follows:
 - Section 345. A. In addition to any other authorization provided by law, the Oklahoma Capitol Improvement Authority is authorized to issue obligations to acquire real property, together with improvements located thereon, and personal property to construct improvements to real property and to provide funding for repairs, refurbishments and improvements to real and personal property of the State Capitol Building in a total amount not to exceed One Hundred Twenty Million Dollars (\$120,000,000.00). The

funds shall be used for the renovation, repair and remodeling of the State Capitol Building.

- B. The Authority may hold title to the property and improvements until such time as any obligations issued for this purpose are retired or defeased and may lease the property and improvements to the Office of Management and Enterprise Services.

 Upon final redemption or defeasance of the obligations created pursuant to this section, title to the property and improvements shall be transferred from the Oklahoma Capitol Improvement Authority to the Office of Management and Enterprise Services.
- C. For the purposes of paying the costs for construction of the real property and improvements, and providing funding for the project authorized in subsection A of this section, and for the purpose authorized in subsection D of this section, the Authority is hereby authorized to borrow monies on the credit of the income and revenues to be derived from the leasing of such property and improvements and, in anticipation of the collection of such income and revenues, to issue negotiable obligations in a total amount not to exceed One Hundred Twenty Million Dollars (\$120,000,000.00) whether issued in one or more series. The Authority is authorized to capitalize interest on the obligations issued pursuant to this section for a period of not to exceed one (1) year from the date of issuance. For subsequent fiscal years, it is the intent of the

- Enterprise Services sufficient monies to make rental payments for
 the purpose of retiring the obligations created pursuant to this
 section. To the extent funds are available from the proceeds of the
 borrowing authorized by this subsection, the Oklahoma Capitol
 Improvement Authority shall provide for the payment of professional
 fees and associated costs related to the project authorized in
 - D. The Authority may issue obligations in one or more series and in conjunction with other issues of the Authority. The Authority is authorized to hire bond counsel, financial consultants, and such other professionals as it may deem necessary to provide for the efficient sale of the obligations and may utilize a portion of the proceeds of any borrowing to create such reserves as may be deemed necessary and to pay costs associated with the issuance and administration of such obligations.
 - E. The obligations authorized under this section may be sold at either competitive or negotiated sale, as determined by the Authority, and in such form and at such prices as may be authorized by the Authority. The Authority may enter into agreements with such credit enhancers and liquidity providers as may be determined necessary to efficiently market the obligations. The obligations may mature and have such provisions for redemption as shall be determined by the Authority, but in no event shall the final

subsection A of this section.

maturity of such obligations occur later than ten (10) years from the first principal maturity date.

- F. Any interest earnings on funds or accounts created for the purposes of this section may be utilized as partial payment of the annual debt service or for the purposes directed by the Authority.
- G. The obligations issued under this section, the transfer thereof and the interest earned on such obligations, including any profit derived from the sale thereof, shall not be subject to taxation of any kind by the State of Oklahoma this state, or by any county, municipality or political subdivision therein.
- H. The Authority may direct the investment of all monies in any funds or accounts created in connection with the offering of the obligations authorized under this section. Such investments shall be made in a manner consistent with the investment guidelines of the State Treasurer. The Authority may place additional restrictions on the investment of such monies if necessary to enhance the marketability of the obligations.
- Oversight Committee. The proceeds from the sale of obligations issued pursuant to the provisions of this section and Section 1 of Enrolled House Bill No. 3168 of the 2nd Session of the 55th Oklahoma Legislature that are needed for repairs to the interior and exterior of the State Capitol shall be subject to the approval of the State Capitol Repair Expenditure Oversight Committee; provided, however,

1 the expenditure of those proceeds shall be subject to a request for proposal process. The Committee shall be composed of nine (9) members as follows: 3 1. Three persons to be appointed by the Governor, one of whom 4 5 shall serve as chair of the Committee; 2. Three legislators to be appointed by the Speaker of the 6 House of Representatives, two of whom shall be members of the 7 majority political party and one of whom shall be a member of the 9 minority political party; and 10 3. Three legislators to be appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, two of whom shall be members of the majority 11 political party and one of whom shall be a member of the minority 12 political party. Five members of the Committee shall constitute a 13 quorum and the vote of five members shall be necessary for any 14 action taken by the Committee. The Committee shall be staffed by 15 employees of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services. The 16 17 Committee shall be subject to the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act. J. The Committee shall deliver a preliminary plan for the 18 renovation, repair and remodeling of the State Capitol to the 19 Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services no 20 later than December 31, 2014. The preliminary plan shall include 21 the following components: 22 1. Establishment of the Office of Management and Enterprise 23 Services' goal and criteria for use by the vendor; and 24

1	2. Selection criteria for the design-build team vendor to be
2	selected through a Request For Proposal process.
3	K. Following receipt of the preliminary plan as approved by the
4	Committee, the Office of Management and Enterprise Services shall
5	solicit Requests For Proposals to select the vendor for the project.
6	L. The Committee shall deliver a final plan to the Director of
7	the Office of Management and Enterprise Services no later than June
8	30, 2015. The final plan shall include the following components:
9	1. Approval of the final scope of work developed by the vendor;
10	and
11	2. Approval of the project phasing developed by the vendor.
12	M. Following delivery of the final plan, the Committee shall
13	continue to oversee the expenditure of proceeds from the sale of
14	obligations issued pursuant to the provisions of this section and
15	Section 1 of Enrolled House Bill No. 3168 of the 2nd Session of the
16	55th Legislature, until completion of the renovation, repair and
17	remodeling of the State Capitol. The Committee may also propose and
18	approve amendments to the plan as it deems appropriate.
19	N. The Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise
20	Services shall have responsibility to substantially implement the
21	plan as presented by the Committee; provided, the President Pro
22	Tempore of the Senate or the Speaker of the House of Representatives
23	shall approve all proposed designs related to renovation, repair and
24	remodeling of space within the State Capitol Building under the

- management and control of the Legislature and allocated to that

 officer's house of the Legislature pursuant to the provisions of

 Section 15.1 of this title, and any subsequent changes to such

 plans. Joint approval of the President Pro Tempore of the Senate

 and the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall be required

 for such plans for space under the management and control of the

 Legislature and not allocated to a specific house of the

 10 this section, the provisions of Section 151 et seq. of this title

- 4. Have authority to approve and submit to the Long-Range Capital Planning Commission any proposed modification, alteration, renovation, repair, or construction on any part of the Capital and the Governor's Mansion Review and approve all requests for

1	preservation, restoration, enhancement, and modification to the
2	State Capitol Building, grounds, and Governor's Mansion submitted by
3	the Capitol Liaison. This review and approval process shall not
4	apply to actions deemed by the State Capitol Building Superintendent
5	to be maintenance necessary for the upkeep and function of the State

- 7 <u>4. Review and approve a security plan submitted by the</u>
 8 <u>Department of Public Safety for the State Capitol Building, grounds,</u>

 - 5. Have final approval authority for any plans or programs for the restoration, preservation, or display of fine art programs in and surrounding the State Capitol Building and the Governor's Mansion;
 - 6. Review and approve administrative rules submitted by the

 Office of Management and Enterprise Services or the Capitol Liaison

 concerning the State Capitol Building, its contents, and its

 concerns;
 - 7. Review and approve preservation zones and design standards for the State Capitol Building, grounds, and Governor's Mansion;
- 20 8. Review and approve standards for the selection,
 21 contributions, and acquisition of works of art and monuments for
 22 permanent and temporary public display in the public spaces
 23 controlled jointly by the Senate and the House of Representatives in

- 1 the State Capitol Building. Such works of art shall be directly
 2 related to the history and culture of this state; and
- 9. Provide oversight and accountability inspections of
 maintenance, restoration, preservation, enhancement, and
 modification projects to ensure all projects conform to design
- B. The Long-Range Capital Planning Commission shall submit any 7 capital construction or renovation project with respect to the State 8 9 Capitol or the Governor's Mansion to the State Capitol Preservation 10 Commission for its advisory opinion prior to consideration by the Long-Range Capital Planning Commission On and after the effective 11 12 date of this act, the State Capitol Preservation Commission shall assume oversight responsibility for restoration projects for the 13 State Capitol Building and the Governor's Mansion from the State 14 Capitol Repair Expenditure Oversight Committee created in Section 15 345 of Title 73 of the Oklahoma Statutes. 16
- 17 SECTION 8. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2021, Section 4105, is

- Section 4105. There is hereby established the position of the Capitol Architect and Curator who shall:

 Commission for design standards and of necessary action on proposed restoration, preservation, enhancement, and modifications in decor or design to ensure preservation and maintenance of the cultural and historic integrity of the State Capitol Building and the Governor's Mansion; and
- 5. Make recommendations to the State Capitol Preservation Commission for preservation zones and design standards.

The Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services may contract for the services of a Capitol Architect and Curator or employ such an individual on either a full- or part-time basis.

Compensation for the position will be in accord with similar professional positions in state government.

- SECTION 9. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 4105.1 of Title 74, unless there
 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
 - A. The State Capitol Building duties of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services (OMES) are as follows:

- 1. OMES shall have the responsibility for maintenance, restoration, preservation, enhancement, and modification of the State Capitol Building, grounds, and Governor's Mansion including facilities planning, facilities construction, and facilities administration;
- 2. OMES shall be responsible for all maintenance duties necessary to properly preserve and maintain the State Capitol Building, grounds, and Governor's Mansion;
- 3. OMES shall be responsible for devising and developing processes for tenants in the State Capitol Building to submit requests for maintenance, restoration, preservation, enhancement, and modification and evaluating such requests;
- 4. OMES shall manage each project, except in State Capitol
 Building areas allotted to the Senate and the House of
 Representatives as defined in Section 15.1 of Title 73 of the
 Oklahoma Statutes, to ensure execution of the highest-quality work
 product, time-cost schedules, and efficient contract performance;
- 5. OMES shall be responsible for producing an annual budget and submitting it to the State Capitol Preservation Commission;

- 6. OMES shall be responsible for creating a long-range master
 plan for the maintenance and upkeep of the State Capitol Building
 and grounds which shall be submitted to the State Capitol
 Preservation Commission every three (3) years;
 - 7. OMES shall contract with the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department and Oklahoma Arts Council to operate the visitor center, visitor relations activities, and tours in the State Capitol Building;
 - 8. OMES shall be responsible for operation of all dining and vending services in the State Capitol Building and shall approve food trucks and other mobile food preparation vehicles on the grounds unless approved by the Legislature;
 - 9. OMES shall be responsible for taking and approving reservations in all meeting rooms and areas of the State Capitol Building and grounds and shall seek approval from the Senate, House of Representatives, or jointly for space allocated to the Legislature by Section 15.1 of Title 73 of the Oklahoma Statutes;
 - 10. OMES shall coordinate with the Oklahoma Arts Council for curation of and care for artwork in the State Art Collection,
 Capitol Art Collection, and monuments, memorials, and all temporary exhibits in public areas at the State Capitol Building and grounds;
- 22 11. OMES shall be responsible for submitting proposed
 23 administrative rules to the State Capitol Preservation Commission to
 24 govern the execution of these duties;

- - 13. OMES shall have the authority to respond promptly to emergency maintenance needs as they arise;
- 14. OMES shall serve as the primary contact for Americans with
 Disabilities Act of 1990 (ADA) compliance for the State Capitol
 Building; and
- 9 15. OMES shall collaborate with the Department of
 10 Transportation for all maintenance, upkeep, and access to all
 11 parking lots on the grounds of the State Capitol Building.
 - B. The Office of Management and Enterprise Services shall employ all staff and consultants necessary to perform the duties of OMES including, but not limited to, a licensed architect.
- SECTION 10. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2021, Section 4108, is amended to read as follows:
- Section 4108. The provisions of Sections 4101 through 4107

 4110.1 of this title shall apply to all modifications in the

 structure or decor of the State Capitol Building, grounds, and the

 Governor's Mansion except for those immediate emergency repairs

 needed to prevent loss or damage to property or to protect the

 health and safety of the public during use of the building and any

 art displayed on the grounds.

SECTION 11. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 4108.1 of Title 74, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The Oklahoma Arts Council shall be given the responsibility to acquire, maintain, preserve, or restore any state-owned art in the State Art Collection or Capitol Art Collection that is in storage or on display in the State Capitol Building and grounds. The council is authorized to hold exhibitions and commissions to display art to the general public. The Oklahoma Arts Council may request direct appropriations or submit requests to the Office of Management and Enterprise Services.

SECTION 12. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2021, Section 4109, is amended to read as follows:

Section 4109. By the order of the Director of the Office of

Management and Enterprise Services, restoration and preservation

Maintenance, restoration, preservation, enhancement, and

modification projects of the State Capitol Building, grounds, or of
the Governor's Mansion may be exempted from the provisions of the
Public Competitive Bidding Act of 1974, Section 101 et seq. of Title
61 of the Oklahoma Statutes. For exempted State Capitol Building or
Governor's Mansion construction projects, the Office of Management
and Enterprise Services shall select among contractors qualified by
past experience to conduct historical preservation projects.

1	SECTION 13. REPEALER 74 O.S. 2021, Sections 4106 and
2	4107, are hereby repealed.
3	SECTION 14. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
4	of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
5	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
6	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
