22       2. "Dating relationship" means intimate association, primarily  
23       characterized by affectionate or sexual involvement. For purposes  
24       of this ~~act~~ section and Section 644 of Title 21 of the Oklahoma

1 Statutes, a casual acquaintance or ordinary fraternization between  
2 persons in a business or social context shall not constitute a  
3 dating relationship;

4 ~~2.~~ 3. "Domestic abuse" means any act of physical harm or the  
5 threat of imminent physical harm which is committed by an adult,  
6 emancipated minor, or minor child thirteen (13) years of age or  
7 older against another adult, emancipated minor or minor child who is  
8 currently or was previously an intimate partner or family or  
9 household member;

10 ~~3.~~ 4. "Family or household members" means:

- 11 a. parents, including grandparents, stepparents, adoptive  
12 parents and foster parents,
- 13 b. children, including grandchildren, stepchildren,  
14 adopted children and foster children,
- 15 c. persons otherwise related by blood or marriage living  
16 in the same household,
- 17 d. persons otherwise related by blood or marriage, or
- 18 e. persons not related by blood or marriage living in the  
19 same household;

20 ~~4.~~ 5. "Foreign protective order" means any valid order of  
21 protection issued by a court of another state or a tribal court;

22 ~~5.~~ 6. "Harassment" means a knowing and willful course or  
23 pattern of conduct by a family or household member or an individual  
24 who is or has been involved in a dating relationship with the

1 person, directed at a specific person which seriously alarms or  
2 annoys the person, and which serves no legitimate purpose. The  
3 course of conduct must be such as would cause a reasonable person to  
4 suffer substantial emotional distress and must actually cause  
5 substantial distress to the person. ~~"Harassment"~~ Harrassment shall  
6 include, but not be limited to, harassing or obscene telephone calls  
7 in violation of Section 1172 of Title 21 of the Oklahoma Statutes  
8 and fear of death or bodily injury;

9 ~~6.~~ 7. "Intimate partner" means:

- 10 a. current or former spouses,
- 11 b. persons who are or were in a dating relationship,
- 12 c. persons who are the biological parents of the same  
13 child, regardless of their marital status or whether  
14 they have lived together at any time, and
- 15 d. persons who currently or formerly lived together in an  
16 intimate way, primarily characterized by affectionate  
17 or sexual involvement. A sexual relationship may be  
18 an indicator that a person is an intimate partner, but  
19 is never a necessary condition;

20 ~~7.~~ 8. "Living in the same household" means:

- 21 a. persons who regularly reside in the same single-  
22 dwelling unit,
- 23 b. persons who resided in the same single-dwelling unit  
24 within the past year, or

1 c. persons who have individual lease agreements whereby  
2 each person has his or her own private bedroom and  
3 shares the common areas;

4 ~~8.~~ 9. "Mutual protective order" means a final protective order  
5 or orders issued to both a plaintiff who has filed a petition for a  
6 protective order and a defendant included as the defendant in the  
7 plaintiff's petition restraining the parties from committing  
8 domestic violence, stalking, harassment or rape against each other.  
9 If both parties allege domestic abuse, violence, stalking,  
10 harassment or rape against each other, the parties shall do so by  
11 separate petition pursuant to Section 60.4 of this title;

12 ~~9.~~ 10. "Rape" means rape and rape by instrumentation in  
13 violation of Sections 1111 and 1111.1 of Title 21 of the Oklahoma  
14 Statutes;

15 ~~10.~~ 11. "Stalking" means the willful, malicious, and repeated  
16 following or harassment of a person by an adult, emancipated minor,  
17 or minor thirteen (13) years of age or older, in a manner that would  
18 cause a reasonable person to feel frightened, intimidated,  
19 threatened, harassed, or molested and actually causes the person  
20 being followed or harassed to feel terrorized, frightened,  
21 intimidated, threatened, harassed, or molested. Stalking also means  
22 a course of conduct composed of a series of two or more separate  
23 acts over a period of time, however short, evidencing a continuity  
24 of purpose or unconsented contact with a person that is initiated or

1 continued without the consent of the individual or in disregard of  
2 the expressed desire of the individual that the contact be avoided  
3 or discontinued. Unconsented contact or course of conduct includes,  
4 but is not limited to:

- 5 a. maintaining a visual or physical proximity to the  
6 individual,
- 7 b. approaching or confronting that individual in a public  
8 place or on private property,
- 9 c. appearing at the workplace of the individual or  
10 contacting the employer or coworkers of the  
11 individual,
- 12 d. appearing at the residence of the individual or  
13 contacting the neighbors of the individual,
- 14 e. entering onto or remaining on property owned, leased  
15 or occupied by the individual,
- 16 f. contacting the individual by telephone, text message,  
17 electronic message, electronic mail, or other means of  
18 electronic communication or causing the telephone or  
19 electronic device of the individual or the telephone  
20 or electronic device of any other person to ring or  
21 generate notifications repeatedly or continuously,  
22 regardless of whether a conversation ensues,
- 23 g. photographing, videotaping, audiotaping, or, through  
24 any other electronic means, monitoring or recording

1 the activities of the individual. This subparagraph  
2 applies regardless of where the act occurs,

3 h. sending any physical or electronic material or  
4 contacting the individual by any means, including any  
5 message, comment, or other content posted on any  
6 Internet site or web application,

7 i. sending to a family member or member of the household  
8 of the individual, or any current or former employer  
9 of the individual, or any current or former coworker  
10 of the individual, or any friend of the individual,  
11 any physical or electronic material or contacting such  
12 person by any means, including any message, comment,  
13 or other content posted on any Internet site or web  
14 application, for the purpose of obtaining information  
15 about, disseminating information about, or  
16 communicating with the individual,

17 j. placing an object on, or delivering an object to,  
18 property owned, leased or occupied by the individual,

19 k. delivering an object to a family member or member of  
20 the household of the individual, or an employer,  
21 coworker, or friend of the individual, or placing an  
22 object on, or delivering an object to, property owned,  
23 leased, or occupied by such a person with the intent  
24 that the object be delivered to the individual, or

1           1.     causing a person to engage in any of the acts  
2                   described in subparagraphs a through k of this  
3                   paragraph; and

4           ~~11.~~ 12. "Victim support person" means a person affiliated with  
5 a domestic violence, sexual assault or adult human sex trafficking  
6 program, certified by the Attorney General or operating under a  
7 tribal government, who provides support and assistance for a person  
8 who files a petition under the Protection from Domestic Abuse Act.
