SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 21 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 14-137 of Title 70, unless there

22 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Α. The State Board of Career and Technology Education, in conjunction with the State Board of Education, shall establish and

Req. No. 2174 Page 1 maintain a pilot program to provide grants to public school districts to offer career and technology programs to students in grades nine through twelve.

- B. A public school district may be eligible to receive a grant pursuant to this section if:
- 1. The public school district can demonstrate that the career and technology program to be offered is not currently available at a technology center school within fifty (50) miles of the school district;
- 2. The public school district can demonstrate with data and research that the career and technology program will meet a workforce need;
- 3. The public school district can demonstrate public support for the career and technology program including student interest in enrolling in the program; and
- 4. The public school district meets any other requirements established by the State Board of Career and Technology Education and the State Board of Education.
- C. 1. A public school district seeking to participate in the pilot program shall apply to the State Board of Career and Technology Education for a grant in the manner and on a form prescribed by the Board. Grant applications shall be reviewed and approved or disapproved by the State Board of Career and Technology Education and the State Board of Education.

- 2. The State Board of Career and Technology Education and the State Board of Education shall ensure that pilot program grants are given to a representative sample of Oklahoma school districts, which shall include:
 - a. a school district with an average daily membership (ADM) of more than two thousand five hundred (2,500) students but fewer than ten thousand (10,000) students,
 - a school district with an ADM of two thousand five
 hundred (2,500) students or fewer, and
 - c. a school district with an ADM of one thousand (1,000) students or fewer.
- D. Subject to the availability of funds, Ten Million Dollars (\$10,000,000.00) shall be allocated by the State Board of Career and Technology Education to fund pilot program grants. Grant amounts shall be determined based on the number of approved applicants and the cost of the proposed career and technology program.
- E. One year after implementation of the pilot program, school districts that receive pilot program grants pursuant to this section shall provide a report to the State Board of Education and the State Board of Career and Technology Education that includes an itemized expenditure list, data on student participation, and recommendations, if any, for future program operations.

The State Board of Education shall review career and 2 technology programs established pursuant to this section to 3 determine if they are eligible for academic credit toward meeting 4 the graduation requirements set forth in Section 11-103.6 of Title 5 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes. 6 The State Board of Career and Technology Education and the 7 State Board of Education shall promulgate rules necessary to 8 implement the provisions of this section. 9 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2026. 10 SECTION 3.
