AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to schools; requiring the State Department of Education to develop and make available certain curriculum for students in certain grades prior to certain school year; providing curricular concepts; allowing curriculum to be taught as a stand-alone unit or integrated into existing courses; directing the Department to post the curriculum on its website and identify certain resources; allowing school districts to teach certain concepts in certain school year; providing opt out of curriculum; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

- A new section of law to be codified SECTION 1. NEW LAW in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 11-103.6g of Title 70, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- Prior to the beginning of the 2027-2028 school year, the State Department of Education shall develop and make available to public high schools in this state a curriculum for students in ninth through twelfth grades to address awareness and prevention of domestic violence and human trafficking. The curriculum shall:

- Teach students how to recognize, prevent, and seek help for domestic violence and human trafficking;
- 2. Teach students the warning signs of dating violence and abusive behavior including both physical and emotional abuse;
- Promote safe and healthy relationships and student wellbeing including healthy relationship communication skills; and
- 4. Be medically accurate and appropriate for the age of the students.
- The curriculum required by subsection A of this section may В. be taught as a stand-alone unit of instruction or may be integrated into one or more existing courses of study.
- The State Department of Education shall post the curriculum on its website and shall identify resources that school districts can use to implement the provisions of this section.
- School districts in this state may begin teaching the concepts provided for in subsection A of this section during the 2027-2028 school year.
- A school district that teaches the concepts provided for in subsection A of this section shall provide an option for the parent or legal guardian of a student to opt the student out of the curriculum.
 - SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2026.
- SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, an emergency is hereby
