Article I, Section 2, Clause 1: "...the Electors in each 20 State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the 21 most numerous Branch of the State Legislature"; 22 2. Article II, Section 2, Clause 3: "Each State shall appoint, 23 in such Manner as the Legislature thereof may direct, a Number of 24 Electors..."; and

Amendment XVII: "The electors in each State shall have the qualifications requisite for electors of the most numerous branch of the State legislatures".

The Legislature also finds that to be qualified and eligible to vote under the laws of this state and the Oklahoma Constitution, a voter must be a resident of this state. No provision of the United States Constitution or any federal law extends the right to vote to individuals who were never domiciled in the United States.

SECTION 2. 26 O.S. 2021, Section 4-101, as AMENDATORY amended by Section 1, Chapter 289, O.S.L. 2024 (26 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 4-101), is amended to read as follows:

Section 4-101. Every person who is a qualified elector as defined provided by Section 1 of Article III of the Oklahoma Constitution shall be entitled to become a registered voter in the precinct of his or her residence, with subject to the following conditions:

- 1. A person who was never domiciled in the United States cannot establish residency in this state and shall not be qualified to vote in this state;
- 2. A United States citizen who was never domiciled in the United States shall not be eligible to register to vote or to vote in this state;
- 3. Residency in this state may not be established in this state if the person was never domiciled in the United States;

- $\underline{4.}$ Persons convicted of a felony shall be eligible to register to vote when they have:
 - a. fully served their sentence of court-mandated calendar days or had their sentence discharged, including any term of incarceration, parole or supervision, or completed a period of probation ordered by any court,
 - b. received a commutation that reduced the sentence of any active felony conviction to time served pursuant to federal or state law and have no other outstanding sentence under any other felony conviction,
 - c. received a commutation pursuant to subsection F of
 Section 332.2 of Title 57 of the Oklahoma Statutes for
 a crime that has been reclassified from a felony to a
 misdemeanor and has no remaining time to serve,
 including:
 - (1) any incomplete term of incarceration,
 - (2) any remaining parole or supervision, or
 - (3) any incomplete period of probation, or
 - d. been granted a pardon pursuant to federal or state law and have no other outstanding sentence under any other felony conviction; and
- $\frac{2\cdot}{5\cdot}$ Any person who has been adjudged to be an incapacitated person as such term is defined by Section 1-111 of Title 30 of the Oklahoma Statutes shall be ineligible to register to vote. When
