6 WHEREAS, 4-H reaches more than 180,000 participants each year 7 through membership, project clubs, and school enrichment; and 8 WHEREAS, Oklahoma State University Extension and Langston 9 University 4-H'ers participate in STEM, civic engagement, healthy 10 living, leisure sciences, natural resources, and agriculture 11 programs; and

WHEREAS, dedicated and committed volunteers, mentors, and supporters play a pivotal role in the success of the organization; and

WHEREAS, youth who participate in 4-H are four times more likely to make contributions to their communities; and

WHEREAS, there are nearly 1,200 adult volunteer leaders who serve as mentors and provide leadership while fostering positive adult/youth partnerships; and

WHEREAS, youth volunteers develop life skills by serving as mentors/role models and provide leadership to club members; and

WHEREAS, 4-H provides programming beyond traditional agricultural projects, including food and nutrition, horticulture,
