COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE

An Act relating to education; specifying apportionment of certain appropriated funds; providing for the budgeting of funds in certain categories and amounts; requiring development of certain performance measures; requiring transfers of certain funds; limiting authority to reduce certain apportionments; requiring certain funds to be expended for certain purposes; stating purposes for allocated funds; requiring certain transfer of funds; stating legislative intent regarding expenditures for direct costs; prohibiting the State Department of Education from contracting for certain administrative costs in certain program; providing for duties and compensation of employees of the State Department of Education; requiring the reduction or withholding of State Aid funds for certain purposes; authorizing the State Board of Education to request transfer of certain funds; authorizing the request of early allocations for certain funds; requiring proportional reductions of allocations under certain conditions; authorizing exemption from budgetary limits for unanticipated federal funds; providing procedures; requiring approval of exemption request under certain conditions; requiring budgeting of certain funds in certain years; requiring certain budgeting procedures; prohibiting certain budgeting procedures;

1 providing an effective date; and declaring an
2 emergency.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

5 SECTION 1. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2026, for the
6 support of public school activities by the State Board of Education
7 payable from monies appropriated and authorized by Enrolled House
8 Bill No. 2766 of the 1st Session of the 60th Oklahoma Legislature
9 shall be apportioned as follows:

10 1. Funds appropriated and authorized by Sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5,
11 6, 7, and 18 of Enrolled House Bill No. 2766 of the 1st Session of
12 the 60th Oklahoma Legislature:

11	Board of Education shall budget all funds in the following	
12	categories and amounts:

1 SECTION 3. The funds appropriated in Sections 13 and 14 of
2 Enrolled House Bill No. 2766 of the 1st Session of the 60th Oklahoma
3 Legislature in the amount of Three Million Two Hundred Fifty
4 Thousand Dollars (\$3,250,000.00) shall be transferred to the School
5 Consolidation Assistance Fund.

6 SECTION 4. The funds appropriated in Sections 15 and 16 of
7 Enrolled House Bill No. 2766 of the 1st Session of the 60th Oklahoma
8 Legislature in the amount of Three Million Two Hundred Fifty
9 Thousand Dollars (\$3,250,000.00) shall be transferred to the
10 Teachers' Retirement System Dedicated Revenue Revolving Fund.

11 SECTION 5. The funds allocated in Section 1 of this act
12 specifically for the purpose of funding the Teachers' Retirement
13 Credit shall be transferred to the Teachers' Retirement System of
14 Oklahoma.

15 SECTION 6. If the funds allocated in Section 1 of this act
16 specifically for the purpose of funding the Teachers' Retirement
17 Credit are insufficient to fully fund the employee contribution
18 credits provided for in Section 17-108.2 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma
19 Statutes as invoiced by the Teachers' Retirement System of Oklahoma,
20 the State Department of Education may reduce in equal proportions
21 funds allocated in Section 1 of this act to Alternative and High
22 Challenge Education, Education Leadership Oklahoma, Advanced
23 Placement Incentives, Strong Readers Act, Required Assessments,
24 Street School, Ag in the Classroom, Imagine Math, Imagine Reading,

1 Oklahoma Imagination Library Program, Oklahoma Arts Institute, Great
2 Expectations, Nationally Recognized Career Readiness Assessments,
3 and Civil Rights Curriculum. The total amount of funds reduced
4 shall not exceed the additional amount required to fully fund the
5 employee contribution credits.

6 SECTION 7. The funds allocated in Section 1 of this act for the
7 purpose of funding Education Leadership Oklahoma shall be expended
8 as follows:

9 1. Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) shall be
10 transferred to the Oklahoma National Board Certification Revolving
11 Fund, created in Section 6-204.4 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma
12 Statutes, for the purpose of awarding annual bonuses as directed;
13 and

14 2. Four Million Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars
15 (\$4,250,000.00) shall be transferred to the Oklahoma School
16 Psychologist, Speech-Language Pathologist, and Audiologist National
17 Certification Revolving Fund, created in Section 6-206.1 of Title 70
18 of the Oklahoma Statutes, for the purpose of awarding annual bonuses
19 as directed.

20 SECTION 8. The funds allocated in Section 1 of this act for
21 Advanced Placement Incentives shall be expended for the purpose of
22 providing assistance for students in financial need, providing
23 grants to districts wanting to start new advanced placement (AP)
24

1 programs, and expanding professional development, pursuant to the
2 provisions of Section 1210.703 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

3 SECTION 9. The funds allocated in Section 1 of this act for the
4 Strong Readers Act shall be expended pursuant to the provisions of
5 Section 1210.508A et seq. of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

6 SECTION 10. The funds allocated in Section 1 of this act for
7 Required Assessments shall be expended for the purpose of
8 administering a statewide student assessment system for grades three
9 through twelve, pursuant to Section 1210.508 of Title 70 of the
10 Oklahoma Statutes.

11 SECTION 11. The funds allocated in Section 1 of this act for
12 Alternative and High Challenge Education shall be expended for the
13 purpose of operating the statewide system of alternative education
14 programs, as provided in Section 1210.568 of Title 70 of the
15 Oklahoma Statutes, and for encouraging school districts to
16 participate in innovative alternative education programs.

17 SECTION 12. The funds allocated in Section 1 of this act for
18 Early Intervention shall be transferred to the Early Intervention
19 Revolving Fund (250). It is the intent of the Legislature that
20 funding available for SoonerStart Early Intervention Services be
21 expended for direct services to eligible infants and toddlers and
22 their families. The State Department of Education shall not
23 contract, pay, or reimburse for administrative cost recovery
24 personnel, accounting, management information system costs, and

1 maintenance and operations at the state or local level or indirect
2 costs which do not comply with the requirements of Section 13-125 of
3 Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

4 SECTION 13. The funds allocated in Section 1 of this act for
5 the Early Childhood Initiative shall be expended for the purpose of
6 funding the early childhood program pursuant to the provisions of
7 Section 10-105.4 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

8 SECTION 14. Of the funds allocated in Section 1 of Enrolled
9 House Bill No. 2766 of the 1st Session of the 60th Oklahoma
10 Legislature, Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000.00) shall be deposited
11 in the Grow Your Own Educator Revolving Fund pursuant to the
12 provisions of Section 2 of Enrolled Senate Bill No. 235 of the 1st
13 Session of the 60th Oklahoma Legislature.

14 SECTION 15. The funds allocated in Section 1 of this act for
15 Civil Rights Curriculum shall be expended pursuant to the provisions
16 of Section 11.103.6p of Title 70 the Oklahoma Statutes.

17 SECTION 16. State Aid funds shall be reduced or withheld by the
18 State Board of Education in an amount necessary to ensure compliance
19 with this act.

20 SECTION 17. The State Board of Education is authorized to
21 request the Office of Management and Enterprise Services to transfer
22 appropriated funds to the appropriate dispensing fund.

23 SECTION 18. The Superintendent of Public Instruction may
24 request through the Director of the Office of Management and

1 Enterprise Services the early transfer by the Oklahoma Tax
2 Commission of tax collections to the Education Reform Revolving Fund
3 for the purpose of early allocation to the State Board of
4 Education's disbursing funds to alleviate cash-flow problems.

5 SECTION 19. If funds appropriated in Sections 1 through 19 of
6 Enrolled House Bill No. 2766 of the 1st Session of the 60th Oklahoma
7 Legislature are not sufficient to fully fund the provisions of this
8 act, each school district that qualifies for funds, excluding
9 Financial Support of Public Schools, pursuant to the provisions of
10 this act shall take a proportionate reduction.

11 SECTION 20. A. The Superintendent of Public Instruction may
12 request, in the manner provided in this section, that receipt and
13 expenditure of unanticipated federal funds awarded after July 1,
14 2024, be exempt from expenditure limitations and from budgetary
15 limitations.

16 1. The Superintendent shall make a request for exemption to the
17 Office of Management and Enterprise Services in writing and file a
18 revised budget work program.

19 2. The Superintendent shall also file copies of the request for
20 exemption and budget work program revisions with the chair of the
21 Appropriations Committee of the Oklahoma State Senate and the chair
22 of the Appropriations and Budget Committee of the Oklahoma House of
23 Representatives. The chair of the Appropriations Committee of the
24 Oklahoma State Senate and/or the chair of the Appropriations and

1 Budget Committee of the Oklahoma House of Representatives shall
2 notify the Office of Management and Enterprise Services of any
3 noncompliance of the request with legislative intent within twelve
4 (12) calendar days of receipt of the exemption request.

5 B. The Office of Management and Enterprise Services shall
6 approve the request for exemption unless both the chair and vice
7 chair of the Legislative Oversight Committee on State Budget
8 Performance provide written notification to the Office of Management
9 and Enterprise Services within twelve (12) calendar days of the
10 Committee's receipt of the exemption request that the exemption
11 subverts the intention and objectives of the Legislature in
12 establishing the original limit. The Office of Management and
13 Enterprise Services shall give written notice of approval or
14 disapproval of each exemption to the agency, the Governor, the chair
15 of the Appropriations Committee of the Oklahoma State Senate, and
16 the chair of the Appropriations and Budget Committee of the Oklahoma
17 House of Representatives within eighteen (18) calendar days of
18 receiving the request.

19 SECTION 21. It is the intent of the Legislature that compliance
20 with the provisions of this act is enforceable pursuant to the
21 provisions of paragraph 9 of subsection A of Section 18b of Title 74
22 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

23 SECTION 22. This act shall become effective July 1, 2025.

1 SECTION 23. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
2 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
3 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
4 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
