**Research Analysis**

HB 1052 as introduced, requires all fire chiefs of municipal fire departments, fire protection districts, and volunteer fire departments to utilize the National Emergency Response Information System (NERIS) to submit incident reports. The measure also requires fire-related burn injuries and death reports to be submitted within 48 hours of the incident.

**Fiscal Analysis**

HB 1052 requires that certain activity reports regarding city fire departments, charitable organizations, and fire protection districts (i.e., Fire Chief) utilize the National Emergency Response Information System (NERIS). The measure does not mandate any action or expenditure by a state agency. Therefore, the measure is not anticipated to have a direct fiscal impact on the state budget or appropriations.
