**Fiscal Analysis**

1067 requires health care providers to retain medical records for at least ten (10) years from the date the patient was last seen by the provider or at least three (3) years from the date of the patient's death. Records of newborns or minors must be retained for a minimum of three (3) years past the age of majority. Additionally, health care providers are required to inform the State Department of Health of the disposition of records in the event of office closure. In its current form, HB 1067 has no direct fiscal impact on the state budget.
