Research Analysis

HB 1111, as introduced, requires the Department of Human Services to develop and implement simplified certification and recertification requirements for SNAP benefits for an individual who meets the following requirements:

- 60 years or older or a person with a disability;
- Has no earned income; and
- Resides in a household in which every individual in the household is 60 or older or has a disability.

The measure outlines what is required in the simplified requirements. The Department will use data matching to inform eligible individuals of the simplified requirements. The measure also increases the standard medical deduction for households with elderly or disabled individuals who are SNAP eligible, raising it to \$175 for households with a single qualifying member and caps it at \$350 for households with more than one qualifying member.
