Research Analysis

The Senate Amendments to HB 1138 directs the Human Capital Management Division and the Civil Service Division of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services to receive and act upon complaints from disciplinary action and grievances filed by state employees employed to perform duties related to peace officers, the Commissioner of Public Safety and the Director of the Department of Corrections. The measure provides these employees are permitted to proceed to a hearing if mediation is unsuccessful.

Fiscal Analysis

The Senate amendment to HB 1138 does not materially alter the prior fiscal impact statement. The measure expressly permits a state agency to receive and act upon certain complaints regarding the whistleblower program provided by the statute. In addition, the measure permits certain hearings where mediation is unsuccessful. The measure is wholly procedural, relating to certain dispute resolutions and administrative law proceedings, rather than directing an expansion of state agency duties or expenditures. Therefore, the measure is not anticipated to have a direct fiscal impact on the state budget or appropriations.
