Research Analysis

HB 1217 makes it unlawful for a person to engage in an adult performance which contains obscene material, or for any political subdivision of this state to allow, permit, organize, or authorize the viewing of an adult performance which contains obscene material, on public property or in a public place where a minor, as part of the general public, will be exposed to view such adult performance. Punishment is a misdemeanor subject to up to 1 year in the county jail, a of between \$500 and \$1,000 or both.

Fiscal Analysis

HB1217 makes certain public performances unlawful. Persons convicted of such crimes shall be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment in a county for not more than 1 year, or by a fine of \$500-\$1000, or by both such fine and imprisonment. Any resulting change to the revenues collected by the Administrative Office of the Courts (AOC) or change in the costs incurred by the Department of Corrections (DOC) are expected to be immaterial and/or absorbed by the agencies. Therefore, this measure in its current form is anticipated to be budget neutral.
