**Research Analysis**

The policy committee recommendation to HB 1364 provides definitions of "artificial intelligence", artificially generated sexual depiction", "generative artificial intelligence" and "visual depiction" as used I the Oklahoma Law on Obscenity and Child Sexual Abuse Material. The measure provides that the use of artificially generated sexual depictions of another is considered nonconsensual dissemination of private sexual images.

**Fiscal Analysis**

The POLREC to HB1364 makes it unlawful to use artificial intelligence to create certain obscene materials. Depending on the offense, persons convicted shall face penalties ranging from a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment in a county jail for up to 10 years, or by a fine of not more than \$1000, or both such fine and imprisonment. Any resulting change to the revenues collected by the Administrative Office of the Courts (AOC) or change in the costs incurred by the Department of Corrections (DOC) are expected to be immaterial and/or absorbed by the agencies. Therefore, this measure in its current form is anticipated to be budget neutral.
