Research Analysis

The senate amendment to HB 1414 allows veterans who served as military police for four or more years to use their years of service to meet the four years of peace officer experience required to run for county sheriff. Veterans must present their Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty form for verification at the time of filing. Lastly, the Secretary of the State Election Board is authorized to create an additional form candidates must submit when providing documentation that proves their completion of the required four years of peace officer experience.

Fiscal Analysis

The Senate amendment to HB 1414 does not materially alter the prior fiscal impact statement. The measure relates to veterans and the time of filing for Certificates of Release or Discharge from Active Duty. In addition, the Secretary of the State Election Board is authorized to create an additional form candidates must submit when providing documentation that proves their completion of the required four years of peace officer experience. Any associated costs are expected to be minimal and absorbed by existing agency resources. Therefore, the measure is not anticipated to have a direct fiscal impact on the state budget or appropriations.
