Research Analysis

The proposed policy committee for HB 1667 gives a grace period of 14 days to all child care professionals to submit the required documentation for the completion of their annual professional development training hours. During this grace period, the professional will remain in compliance with licensing and employment requirements. Employers and regulatory agencies must not impose penalties, suspensions, or employment terminations solely based on the pending processing of professional development hours during the grace period. Additionally, the Department of Human Services must ensure that the review period for early childhood education provider training applications is no greater than 14 days.

Fiscal Analysis

The proposed committee substitute to HB 1667 allows child care professionals a fourteen (14) day grace period to provide the required documentation showing completion of their annual professional development training hours.
