Research Analysis

The Senate Amendments to HB 1789 provides that the areas within municipal, county, or state-owned or - controlled facilities or within the grounds of any county, district, or state fair are exempt from manufacturer-designated areas of sales responsibility, only for the purposes of sponsored off-premises sales events. Dealers promoting its own private off-premises sales event, where the dealer is the sole participating dealer may not conduct sales activity or display for sale recreational vehicles outside its manufacturer0designated area of sales responsibility. A dealer participating in a sponsored off-premises sales event with other participating dealers may conduct sales activity or display for sale recreational vehicles inside or outside the area of sales responsibility. A dealer may not be denied a permit to sell at an off-premises location on the grounds that the sales promotion is being held within the relevant market area of another dealer of the same line-make. The measure requires a dealer to obtain written approval from the manufacturer or distributor to participate in a private recreational vehicle show and the sponsoring entity of a private sales event must provide written permission for the dealer to conduct the event on the sponsor's property.

Fiscal Analysis

The Senate amendment to HB 1789 does not materially alter the prior fiscal impact statement. The measure deals exclusively with recreation vehicle dealers within the private sector, and does not mandate any action or expenditure by a state agency. Therefore, the measure is not anticipated to have a direct fiscal impact on the state budget or appropriations.
