**Fiscal Analysis**

The conference committee recommendation to HB 2162 restores title and enacting clause to the measure. Five Million Nine Hundred Thirty-five Thousand Dollars (\$5,935,000) is directed from the Conservation Commission's overall base budget to the Terry Peach Water Restoration Fund to address additional invasive woody species eradication efforts referenced in this measure.

HB 2162 modifies and expands the Terry Peach Water Restoration Act to become a statewide program targeting several harmful woody species. The Conservation Commission has estimated that a statewide expansion of this program would have a total fiscal impact of Ten Million Dollars (\$10,000,000); the agency would require Nine Million Dollars (\$9,000,000) in additional state funding towards this program. Therefore, the fiscal impact to FY-26 state budgetary resources is \$9,000,000.
