Research Analysis

CCR B adds the report instructions.

HB2262 adds that a facility advertising memory care must disclose the type of care provided. The measure adds that a referral agency provide any representative of a person who has notified the referral agency of a Alzheimer's or other dementia diagnosis who is considering placement electronic or physical access to the form for each facility. The State Department of Health will maintain a public searchable database of forms. If no form is available from the Department, this will not apply. Neither a facility or referral agency will liable for the action or inaction of others.

The measure provides that if a facility violates any of the act's provisions, they will be subject to established notice and enforcement provisions. The measure also requires a poster be in a conspicuous location in a Alzheimer's dementia or other forms of dementia unit stating that if such persons or a representative were not given a copy of the disclosure form that they may file a complaint with the Consumer Protection Unit of the Office of Attorney General.

Fiscal Analysis

The CCR B to HB 2262 specifies disclosure requirements for certain referral agencies and facilities under the Alzheimer's Dementia and Other Forms of Dementia Special Care Disclosure Act. Those who engage in false advertising of memory care services are subject to penalties, as provided by the Act. In its current form, HB 2262 is not anticipated to have a direct fiscal impact on the state budget.
