**Research Analysis**

The senate amendment to HB 2459 exempts mobile food vehicles that did not have an automatic fire extinguishing system prior to July 1, 2024 from the requirement to install them according to current code, as long as they have portable fire extinguishers installed in their vehicles. A six liter Class K-rated portable fire extinguisher is required for all cooking equipment involving solid fuels or vegetable oils, animal oils, or fats.

The measure requires the State Fire Marshal to inspect and issue operational permits annually to mobile food vehicles. Inspections coordinated by the State Fire Marshal must be held within each of the four quadrants of the state and held twice within counties with a population exceeding 400,000.

All mobile food vehicles that utilize liquified petroleum gas are to be inspected by and to receive a permit from the Oklahoma Liquified Petroleum Gas Administration. The permit received from the Oklahoma Liquified Petroleum Gas Administration is in conjunction with the operational permit issued by the State Fire Marshal. The provisions of this measure expire July 1, 2026.
