**Research Analysis**

The policy committee recommendation to HB 2720 creates the Targeted Violence Prevention Act. The measure authorizes the Department of Homeland Security and the Oklahoma Counter Terrorism Intelligence Center to collect, analyze, and disseminate information to law enforcement and public safety agencies regarding individuals reasonably suspected of involvement in terrorism, targeted violence, threats to public safety, or any other threats of organized or violent crime.

**Fiscal Analysis**

The POLREC to HB2720 creates the Targeted Violence Prevention Act, and sets forth duties related to records retention to be carried out by the Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security, the Oklahoma Counter Terrorism Intelligence Center (OCTIC), and the Department of Public Safety. The entities involved do anticipate a direct fiscal impact as a result of the measure. Therefore, there is no expected impact to state budget or appropriations.
