Research Analysis

The Senate Amendment restores the Title.

HB 2724 allows the Oklahoma Highway Patrol to donate surplus vehicles which have more than 90,000 miles to local law enforcement agencies in counties with a population of less than 100,000 residents. The donated vehicles must be used for authorized law enforcement efforts.

Fiscal Analysis

HB2724 allows the Oklahoma Highway Patrol to donate surplus vehicles to certain local law enforcement agencies. According to officials with the Department of Public Safety (DPS), the agency currently receives roughly \$275,000 in revenue per year as a result of auctioning surplus vehicles, and currently uses that revenue to fund vehicle equipment. If these vehicles were to be donated, these revenues would no longer be received by the agency. However, DPS does not intend to seek additional funding to offset this lost revenue. Therefore, in its current form, DPS may lose some revenues that are used to fund vehicle equipment, but no material impact to state budget or appropriations is anticipated.

The SAHB does not change the fiscal impact of the measure as described above.
