Research Analysis

The committee substitute for HB2784 authorizes the Oklahoma State University Medical Authority (OSUMA) to enter into a cooperative venture to train students at a Level 1 Trauma Center operated by the Trust or an affiliated entity of the Trust for the purpose of Medicaid supplemental payments. OSUMA must provide an annual certification to the Oklahoma Health Care Authority that the trauma center meets the standards for receiving Medicaid supplemental payments. The measure outline which entities in the state qualify for the partnership and also creates the Emergency Medicine Revolving Fund for OSUMA.

Fiscal Analysis

HB 2784 authorizes the Oklahoma State University Medical Authority (OSUMA) to enter into agreements and cooperative ventures for the purpose of training students within a Level 1 Trauma Center. OSUMA is required to annually certify to the Oklahoma Health Care Authority (OHCA) that the Level 1 trauma center meets standards and requirements for Medicaid supplemental payments. Additionally the measure creates the Emergency Medicine Revolving Fund within the Oklahoma State University Medical Authority (OSUMA) for the purpose of training students within an American College of Surgeons Level 1 Trauma Center.

HB 2784 could lead to an increase in the number of providers and facilities eligible for Medicaid supplemental payments. As a result, the expansion could increase federal reimbursements and the overall Medicaid supplemental payments in the state.
