**Research Analysis**

The committee substitute for HB2791 appropriates the following amounts from the Statewide Recovery Fund to the Department of Human Services (DHS):

- \$195,000 to help with increased construction costs for a facility that serves domestic violence victims;
- \$328,000 for a food program that focuses on food distribution, education, workforce development, and health assessments; and
- \$5 million to help expand capacity for child care services.

The measure also creates the Statewide Recovery Special Account for the DHS, provides that the DHS cannot spend more than 2 percent of the funds on administrative costs, and requires the DHS to submit quarterly report the Legislature on its expenditures and contracts.

**Fiscal Analysis**

HB 2791 appropriates funds from the Statewide Recovery Fund to the Department of Human Services (DHS) to support increased costs related to projects funded through the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021. The measure allocates One Hundred Ninety-Five Thousand Dollars (\$195,000) for the Spring Shelter, Three Hundred Twenty-Eight Thousand Dollars (\$328,000) for Food on the Move, and Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000) for YMCA facilities. These are existing funds that were transferred back to the Statewide Recovery Fund and do not represent new or additional funding.
