**Research Analysis**

The Senate Amendment to HB 2837 requires all employees of a licensed medical marijuana business to complete an educational training course beginning January 1, 2027, as opposed to Jan. 1, 2026.

HB 2837 requires that, starting Jan. 1, 2027, in order to receive an employee credential, all employees of a licensed medical marijuana business must complete an approved educational training course and will be required to submit proof of completion in order to receive an employee credential. This training may include an overview of state statutes and administrative rules, patient privacy requirements, and the safe handling and storage of medical marijuana.

**Fiscal Analysis**

HB 2837 requires employees of licensed medical marijuana businesses to complete educational training courses and to submit proof of the training to the Oklahoma Medical Marijuana Authority (OMMA) when applying or renewing their credentials. HB 2837 is not anticipated to have a direct fiscal impact on the state budget or appropriations.

The Senate amendment does not change the fiscal impact from the previous House analysis.
