Research Analysis

HB 2936, as introduced, provides that any person that has been convicted of a crime against a child may not be an intended parent of a child to be born under a gestational carrier agreement. The measure also expands its definition of a crime against a child that would stop a prospective adoptive parent from having a child's placement approved if a person with a crime against a child felony offense resides in the home.

Fiscal Analysis

HB 2936 prohibits the placement of a child through a gestational agreement or adoption if any individual involved has been convicted of a crime against a child, such as sexual abuse. In its current form, HB 2936 is not anticipated to have a direct fiscal impact on the state budget.
