**Research Analysis**

The Policy Committee Substitute to HB 2979 directs the Department of Transportation to establish 45 mph school zones on portions of state highways upon the request of a local jurisdiction. The highway must meet certain conditions. The Department is to erect appropriate signage with maintenance and cost of operation to be the responsibility of the local jurisdiction.

**Fiscal Analysis**

According to the Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT), for each location where a school zone would be implemented the total cost to do so is \$19,000.00. The breakdown is as such:

Materials	\$12,500.00
Design	\$3,000.00
Labor and Equipment	\$3,500.00

ODOT had identified 14 locations where such a school zone would need to be implemented, leading to a total cost of \$266,000.00
