**Research Analysis**

HB 2996 provides that any records submitted in an electronic format to Service Oklahoma by an eligible entity shall not require notarization and shall be exempt from any notarization requirements pursuant to Title 47. Any records being submitted to Service Oklahoma to create an electronic format document, including, but not limited to, vehicle titling or registration is also exempt.

**Fiscal Analysis**

House Bill 2996 creates a new exemption from notarization for certain electronic records submitted to Service Oklahoma by eligible entities. Existing electronic processing practices already occur and no new expenditures, staffing, or revenues are authorized by the measure. Therefore, the measure is not anticipated to have a direct fiscal impact on the state budget or appropriations.
