**Research Analysis**

HB 3011, as introduced, requires someone making beer, cider or wine for personal use to be 21 or older. An individual making these beverages should do so solely for personal use, for use by family or guests, for distribution at nonprofit events, and for transport to and use at organized affairs, exhibitions, or competitions including homemaker contests, tastings, or judging. The measure removes beer, cider, and wine made for personal use from the list of alcohol excise tax exclusions and repeals [37A O.S. 2021, Section 2-140](#), which authorized the ABLE Commission to issue a Personal Use Permit.
