**Research Analysis**

HB 3029, as introduced, requires the State Board of Education to create a four-year plan to address the State Department of Education's needs. The Board must review and update the plan annually. It must include long-term and short-term goals and strategies for achieving them. Further, it must include a description of any proposed programs, and costs and measurement criteria for current and future programs. The Board must submit the plan annually to the Governor and Legislative leaders by December 1.
