**Research Analysis**

HB 3051, as introduced, makes changes to the Tulsa Reconciliation Education and Scholarship Program. The measure:

- Replaces references to "residents" with "students";
- Increases the qualifying income cap to \$125,000;
- Requires applicants to submit an attestation about their verifiable documents;
- Caps entry into participation at age 20; and
- Allows the State Regents to contract with Tulsa Public School District to administer the program.

**Fiscal Analysis**

As written, the measure is not anticipated to result in a negative fiscal impact on the state budget or appropriations. By increasing the income cap, there could potentially be more scholarships granted. As such, this could reduce any investment income that could be reinvested for the purposes of growing the corpus.
