Research Analysis

HB 3053 would require the Pardon and Parole Board to grant parole to persons who:

- Are 65 years of age or older;
- Statutorily eligible for parole;
- Have no serious infractions within the preceding 3 years;
- Have completed all required programs and treatment courses;
- Have maintained continuous compliance with institutional rules and regulations; and
- Does not fall within an exclusion.

Persons serving life without parole or for an offense for which parole is prohibited or who present a documented threat of imminent physical harm to others are excluded from this parole procedure.
