Research Analysis

The policy committee recommendation to HB 3056 excludes from the Oklahoma Milk and Milk Products Act the sales of unpasteurized cow, goat, sheep, donkey, and horse milks to consumers at:

- Feed stores;
- Restaurants for off-site consumption only;
- Farmer's markets; or
- Via delivery from the farm where the milk is produced.

This measure strikes language that limited the monthly incidental sales of goat milk to 100 gallons. This measure also limits liability of raw, unpasteurized milk producers or sellers for any incidental illnesses caused by consumption of raw, unpasteurized milk sold to a consumer under this section.

Fiscal Analysis

The policy committee recommendation to HB 3056 excludes unpasteurized cow milk, goat milk, sheep milk, donkey milk, and horse milk from the provisions of the Oklahoma Milk and Milk Products Act. The measure contains language that clarifies that consumption of the milk must be done off-premises when purchased at a restaurant as well as language that prohibits producers or sellers of raw, unpasteurized milk from being liable for consumer illness related to the consumption of said milk. Upon review, this measure has no direct fiscal or revenue considerations for the state.
