Research Analysis

HB 3142, as introduced, modifies the fees imposed on the sale of propane tanks. The measure clarifies that the fee must be used to offset the cost of inspecting propane tanks and also clarifies that distributors who ship propane tanks into Oklahoma from out-of-state must also pay such fee. The measure requires each separate Class VII permitted location where propane tanks are sold to pay a flat, annual fee. The state Liquefied Petroleum Gas Administrator is authorized to adopt a system that identifies the tanks on which the fees have been paid, which may include identification tags. A 25% penalty is added if the fee is not paid within 35 days of notice. Tanks must be marked as to who owns them. Containers owned by one permit holder can only be used or filled by another permit holder with the owner's authorization.

The measure also authorizes the Liquefied Petroleum Gas Board to investigate propane tank accidents, and requires certain officials to notify the Board within one business day any time an accident occurs.

Lastly, the measure allows the State Liquefied Petroleum Gas Administrator to issue Class V Food Truck Permits.

Fiscal Analysis

HB 3142 modifies and updates various statutory provisions regarding fees on the sale of propane tanks, which shall be used to offset any additional inspection or investigation costs. Any fiscal or revenue impacts would be imposed upon the Liquefied Petroleum Gas Board, a non-appropriated state entity. Therefore, this measure has no direct fiscal impact on state budgetary resources.
