**Research Analysis**

HB 3143, as introduced, requires the Oklahoma Medical Marijuana Authority (OMMA) to extend the moratorium on processing and issuing new medical marijuana business licenses, beginning Aug 1, 2026 and ending Aug 1, 2028. The Executive Director of the Authority is authorized to terminate the moratorium any time prior to August 1, 2028, if it's determined that all pending licensing reviews, inspections, or investigations are complete.

The measure prohibits medical marijuana businesses from transferring without written approval of an application by OMMA. Additionally, any medical marijuana business licensee intending to transfer ownership will not be able to submit an application if they are subject to any administrative action that may result in a revocation, suspension, or nonrenewal of their license. Any pending administration action or appeal must be completed in full prior to submitting any transfer applications. If the business license or OBNDD registration is annulled, revoked, or suspended due to an administrative action, the licensee is prohibited from applying for a transfer of the business for not less than 6 months after completion of the annulment, revocation, or suspension term.

**Fiscal Analysis**

HB 3143 extends the moratorium on issuing new medical marijuana business licenses for dispensaries, processors, and commercial growers until August 1, 2028. It also establishes additional restrictions on ownership transfers of existing businesses. The provisions of the measure are not expected to impact OMMA's resources or have a negative impact on the state budget.
