**Research Analysis**

HB 3259, as introduced, provides that a health insurance provider may not offer to a general contracting entity a provider network contract or enter into a provider network contract that includes an all-or-nothing, anti-steering, gag, or most favored nation clause. A health insurance provider may also not amend or renew an existing provider network contract so that it retains or adds one of these clauses. Any of the listed provisions in a provider network contract are void and unenforceable. A general contracting entity that encourages an enrollee to obtain a health care service from a particular provider has a duty to engage in that conduct only for the primary benefit of the enrollee.
