Research Analysis

The amendment to the proposed committee substitute for HB 3287 removes the language directing the Oklahoma State Department of Health to make rules coordinating the specifications of the signage and instead directs the Department to make the signage available for print on the Department's public website. Hospitals and health care facilities may request the signage is mailed to them for the cost of printing and first class postage.

HB3287 requires, upon the effective date, every hospital and health care facility in the state to post domestic violence and human trafficking signage in inconspicuous areas throughout the facility and in areas deemed private and for patient and provider use only. The signage must contain information stating that if you are a victim of domestic abuse, being forced or have been forced to perform any sexual act, or are a victim of human trafficking to notify facility staff immediately. Hospitals and health care facilities must develop protocols and procedures to be used for reporting alleged or confirmed cases of domestic abuse and human trafficking for commercial sex to appropriate law enforcement agencies if requested to do so prior to release by the victim. The protocols must include procedures for assisting law enforcement and the victim in securing discharge or release without interference from or notification to the alleged perpetrator. The Oklahoma State Department of Health must make the signage available for print. Hospitals and health care facilities may request the signage is mailed to them for the cost of printing and first class postage.

Fiscal Analysis

HB 3287 requires hospitals and health care facilities to post signage on domestic violence and human trafficking throughout their facility. These entities must also develop protocols for reporting cases to law enforcement. The State Department of Health (OSDH) is required to make the signage available for printing on its website, and hospitals and health care facilities can request mailed copies for the cost of printing and postage.

Since hospitals and health care facilities would be responsible for printing and mailing costs, OSDH has confirmed that the measure's directives are feasible within existing resources. As amended, HB 3287 is not expected to have a direct fiscal impact on the state budget or appropriations.
