**Research Analysis**

HB 3302 removes the restriction on the carrying of firearms into buildings owned or leased by a city, town, or county. The measure clarifies that firearms may not be carried at any public building used for a public meeting conducted under the Open Meeting Act, at any public facility providing substance abuse or mental health services or the State Capitol Building. The measure allows the carrying of concealed weapons at events held on the fairgrounds and in buildings that are open to the general public during the Oklahoma State Fair or the Tulsa State Fair. The event holder may authorized the open carry of firearms during the Oklahoma State Fair or the Tulsa State Fair. A public trust may authorize the open carry of firearms on the property of the public trust or nonprofit entity. The measure allows for the prohibition of the carrying of firearms a a national softball tournament event at the USA Softball Hall of Fame Complex, or a national or international Quarter Horse event.
