Research Analysis

The policy committee recommendation to HB 3304 prohibits Service Oklahoma from issuing an original driver license to any person who is required to register on the methamphetamine offender registry. Service Oklahoma is required to verify that an applicant for a commercial driver license is not on the registry.

Fiscal Analysis

The proposed policy committee recommendation for HB 3304 creates the Ray Davis Safe Roads Act and amends Title 47 to prohibit issuance of a Class A, B, or C commercial driver license to an applicant whose name appears on the methamphetamine offender registry, and requires Service Oklahoma to verify registry status prior to issuance. The measure creates new law in the sense that it provides a name, but the language related to the methamphetamine offender registry is purely amendatory regarding a pre-existing system. Such changes are not expected to significantly increase administrative workload. Therefore, the measure is not anticipated to have a direct fiscal impact on the state budget or appropriations.
