Research Analysis

HB 3310 as introduced, authorizes the Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services (OMES) to promulgate payment procedure rules for contract invoice payments. Such rules must include procedures for determining of the legitimacy of invoices and establish a 60-day window for invoice payment by state agencies. OMES is tasked with developing a report that identifies state agencies found not in compliance with these rules. The report must include the date the agency became noncompliant and the date the agency regained compliance. This report is to be available on the OMES website.

Additionally, the State Purchasing Director must submit an annual non-compliance report to the Governor and legislative leadership by January 31 that lists all non-compliant state agencies and the number and aggregate amount of their unpaid invoices. Based on the annual non-compliance report, the Director of OMES must give recommendations for a prospective reduction in agency appropriations provided for administrative expenses of non-compliant agencies to legislative leadership. The reduction cannot be more than two percent.

Lastly, the measure establishes that the chief executive officer of any agency found not in compliance is disqualified from receiving a compensation increase or longevity pay.

Fiscal Analysis

House Bill 3310 amends existing law to modify administrative procedures. Any incremental administrative workload associated with implementation is expected to be absorbed within existing agency resources.
