Research Analysis

The second proposed committee substitute for HB 3312 allows school districts to annually provide students with age-appropriate instruction on firearm safety. The Council on Law Enforcement Education and Training (CLEET), in consultation with Department of Education, will determine which grade is most appropriate to begin providing instruction. The agencies will also approve a curriculum, which may not bear a brand affiliation and must be politically neutral.

Instruction provided to students in grades K-5 must focus on not touching a firearm. Instruction for students in grades 6- 12 will focus on safe storage, handling, avoiding injury, and what to do if a firearm is found.

Schools may determine how to incorporate the instruction, although instruction from a CLEET-certified SRO, or member of law enforcement will be considered best practice. Instruction may never involve live ammunition. Lastly, if a district chooses to require such instruction, they must give parents the opportunity to opt-their children out.
