**Research Analysis**

HB3314, as introduced, allows counties to impose a voter-approved public service impact tax of up to 15 percent, on retail marijuana sales. Revenue from the tax will be used to support county sheriffs, local police and fire departments, or for remediation of dilapidated or blighted properties.

To enact the tax, it must receive majority approval in a special election called by county commissioners or initiated through a petition signed by at least 5 percent of registered voters. If the measure fails, the same tax cannot be reconsidered for six months.
