Research Analysis

HB 3334, as introduced, creates the "Limited Retail-to-On-Premises Alcohol Supply Act," which allows an on-premises licensee to purchase alcoholic beverages from an off-premises licensee under certain conditions. Both licensees must maintain detailed records and retain them for 24 months to be provided upon to the ABLE Commission or the Oklahoma Tax Commission. Violations of this act are subject to fines, license suspension, or revocation. The ABLE Commission will promulgate rules to implement and enforce this measure, but they are prohibited from making an expansion of eligible products of frequency. Nothing in this act will be construed to permit slotting fees, tied product placements, or incentives or inducements that conflict with federal law.

Fiscal Analysis

HB3334 creates the Limited Retail-to-On-Premises Alcohol Supply Act, which allows on-premises alcohol licensees to purchase alcoholic beverages from off-premises licensees under certain conditions. The measure establishes recordkeeping requirements, provides penalties of up to \$1,000 per violation, and directs the ABLE Commission to promulgate rules for implementation. Any costs associated with rule promulgation and enforcement activities are expected to be absorbed in accordance with the normal duties of the ABLE Commission. Therefore, in its current form, HB3334 is not anticipated to have a material impact on state budget or appropriations.
