**Research Analysis**

The third proposed policy committee substitute for HB 3338 directs the Construction Industries Board to issue and regulate swimming pool contractor licenses. By November 1, 2026, the board must establish requirements for experience, training, continuing education, and examinations to obtain the license. The initial license fee is \$500, with an annual renewal fee of \$300. A swimming pool contractor license does not authorize an individual to perform electrical or plumbing work beyond standard pool installation or connected to a public water supply, sanitary sewer, or electrical service.

**Fiscal Analysis**

The proposed policy committee substitute to HB 3338 creates the Pool Contractor Licensing Act and directs the Construction Industries Board to establish and administer a new swimming pool contractor licensing program, including rulemaking, examinations, and ongoing regulatory oversight. The measure establishes a fee structure to offset associated administrative costs. Implementation costs are expected to be absorbable within existing budgetary resources. Therefore, the measure is not anticipated to have a direct fiscal impact on the state budget or appropriations.
