**Research Analysis**

HB 3344, as introduced, outlines requirements for persons applying to be foster parents. Any person who willfully makes a false or fraudulent application or provides false or fraudulent information or any person that aids or abets another in this will, upon conviction, be guilty of a felony.

**Fiscal Analysis**

HB 3344 introduces new requirements for foster parent applicants and specifies penalties for providing fraudulent information.
